

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

# The Universidade Católica Portuguesa opens you the doors to the world.




Expanding an experience of over five decades, as a pioneer in the teaching of Management, back in 1972, Universidade Católica Portuguesa has an increasingly global presence.

Investing in a more comprehensive education is a good start.


When projecting your future, a quality job will certainly be a part of your plans.

### Flexibility when choosing between Economics and Management

The first year has subjects common to both undergraduate programmes. The possibility to change from one programme to another is always possible.

### Structure of the undergraduate programmes study plan

Duration of the degree: <u>6 semesters</u> (3 years). Total of ECTS\*: 180 divided between:

- Mandatory courses common to both undergraduate programmes (16 courses, 96 ECTS);
- Economics or Management specific courses (12 courses, 72 ECTS);
- Free electives (2 courses, 12 ECTS).

\*(ECTS – European Credit Transfer System) – Each course corresponds to 6 ECTS. The ECTS is an European student-centred system created to facilitate the recognition of workload and competences / skills acquired by the students (classes, personal work, mentoring, group works, etc.).

#### **Free Electives**

2 free elective courses from any scientific area (apart from Economics and Management) in any school of the country or overseas as long as they are authorized to do so.

#### The flexible structure of the program allows:

- International experience: new experiences, new cultures, wider contact network;
- Diversified education;
- Exploring areas of personal interest.

#### **Welcoming activities**

A set of experiences\* that will allow you to integrate into the environment of Católica Porto Business School.

\*Mandatory attendance to new students of the undergraduate programmes.

#### **Project courses**

- A new paradigms, a new approach: A methodology focused on the students and in the learning outcomes.
- 3 courses aligned with each other, fostering theoretical learning and practical experience.
- Aimed at skills development for a future work experience.
- Dynamic programme contents inspired in the state of the art, teachers' research, and the corporate and organisational world needs.
- · Integration in multidisciplinary teams that cover a wide range of scientific areas.;
- · It widens the pool of first quality jobs.

### Undergraduate programmes Instrumental curricular requirements

Besides the approval in the study plan (180 ECTS), it is necessary the approval in the following requirements:

- English language;
- Calculus sheet (Excel) and word processing (Word);
- · Additional course with no ECTS in Christianity, Cultures and Organisations.

Students cannot finish the programme without approval in these requirements.

## Double Degree Programme in Law and Management

1 Programme,2 Degrees, infinitecareer opportunities

The partnership between two schools of reference of the Universidade Católica Portuguesa in Porto – the Católica Porto Law School and Católica Porto Business School – allows the students to obtain 2 degrees in 5 years.

The advantages of this double degree in Law and Management are:

- A more integrated view of the business world;
- The ability to work in multidisciplinary teams that require the knowledge and articulation of both areas;
- To allow students to follow juridical careers and to have a role in management in companies of the public and private sectors.

## Scholarships and Excellence Awards

### Scholarships and Excellence Awards

#### Every effort is worth a reward

We reward the merit and the high academic performance of our students with Scholarships and Excellence Awards.

#### Scholarships: Full (100%) and Partial (80%, 50%, 20%)

Scholarships are awarded to the best students, defined by the ranking of the final classification for admission to the first year, in the first period and the first stage of national call for applications.

### Excellence Awards: Full - Católica Top Honours (100%) and Partial - Católica Honours (80%, 50%, 20%)

The Excellence Awards are granted to the best students who pass to the second and subsequent years of the Undergraduate Programmes, based on their previous academic year performance.

#### Scholarships and Excellence Awards – Number and Amounts

The number and amounts of Scholarships and Excellence Awards are set up each academic year by Dispatch from the School Board of FEG/CPBS.










































































# Life at Católica is much more


